

Goldberg to portray nun

Movie will depict life and deeds of Sister Thea

Actress Whoopi Goldberg will play the part of Sister Thea Bowman in a film being planned on the life of the former La Crosse nun.

Sister Thea, known nationally for her work with the black Catholic community in Canton, Miss., is a member of the La Crosse-based Franciscan Sisters of Perpetual Adoration.

The film is being produced by actor Harry Belafonte, who met Sister Thea in New Orleans last year, according to FSPA presi-

Goldberg, who received an Academy Award Oscar nomination for her starring role in "The Color Purple," was Sister Thea's choice, Sister Patricia said.

The 51-year-old Sister Thea, who has been battling cancer since 1985, also is the subject of a book being planned for publication by Harper and Row. Black author Margaret Walker Alexander has been commissioned to write the book. Alexander is the author of "Jubilee," a book about black culture and history. She also recently published the story
